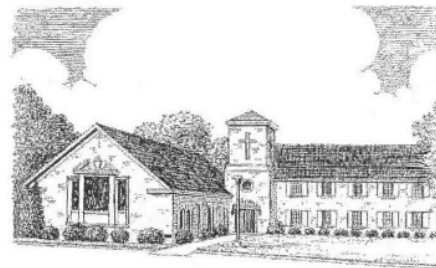

Many of you know my great love for music and singing. Of singing, St. Augustine said, "For he that singeth praise, not only praiseth, but only praiseth with gladness: he that singeth praise, not only singeth, but also loveth him of whom he singeth. In praise, there is the speaking forth of one confessing; in singing, the affection of one loving." That quote in time became shortened to say, "He who sings, prays twice."

have in quite some time. I am thankful for the warmth and friendship you have extended to me and look forward to deepening the relationship God has begun in us.

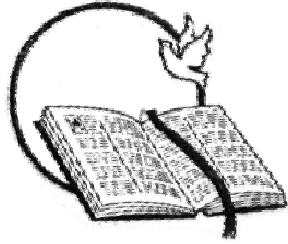
I am including the lyrics for "Awake, Awake". Please find some quiet time to meditate upon those lyrics and see what the Spirit says to you.

### “...All My Wonders” Ex. 3:20

Recently, while taking my weekly chemo treatment, I felt God's leading to review the life and call of Moses which is in Exodus. It was interesting to ponder that Moses was born to parents from the tribe of Levi and to think about how he would have been a priest had he been raised in the Hebrew community. To save his life from the order of the Pharaoh who demanded that every Hebrew son born be cast into the river, his mother put Moses in an arc of bulrushes and placed him upon the waters. Eventually he was rescued by the Pharaoh's daughter who raised him as her own son, and as his son, Moses would have lived the life of a prince.

As an adult, Moses killed an Egyptian who was beating a Hebrew slave and, fearing for his own life, he fled to Midian where the descendants of Abraham and his second wife, Keturah, lived. Returning to his family roots, Moses retired on the backside of the desert mountain and became a shepherd. It was during this time that He encountered God Himself who appeared to him in a flame of a fire from the midst of a burning bush. It was not unusual for these types of desert bushes to catch on fire, but it was extremely unusual for them not to be consumed. While Moses was preoccupied with trying to figure out why the bush was not consumed by the fire, God spoke to Moses identifying himself as the God of Abraham who had seen the oppression of His people in Egypt and had heard their cries, knew their sorrows and bondage under the Egyptian taskmasters. Often, like Moses, we are often preoccupied by our own thoughts and understandings of situations while God is trying to speak His wisdom, plans and assignments to us! It was like that for me that day: I was trying to figure out the new reports from the tests and CT Scans with my own knowledge and understanding while God Himself wanted to speak His wisdom to me! I got the

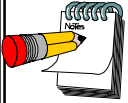
point and asked God to forgive me for leaning to my own understanding instead of hearing His voice!

What was God saying to Moses? God told Moses He had come down to deliver His people and to lead them into a land flowing with milk and honey, and He was going to do that by sending Moses to the Pharaoh to bring His people out of Egypt. God identified Himself to Moses as the "I Am Who I Am" - the all self-existing God who is and was and always will be! God warned Moses that the Pharaoh would not let the people go, so He would stretch out His hand and strike Egypt with "all His wonders" which would eventually cause their release! Wonders? Let's review these "wonders" - waters turned to blood, frogs, lice, flies, diseased livestock, boils, hail, locusts, darkness, and the death of the first-born! These look more like evil plagues, but are called "wonders" in the biblical account! As I was pondering these "wonders," I thought about all the tests, procedures and treatments I had experienced in dealing with the cancer over the previous four years, and they seemed more like plagues or "necessary evils" than "wonders!" That very day, I embraced a new concept - I embraced the word "wonders" to describe the experiences which would eventually cause the enemy of cancer to let me go! I was encouraged to be reminded that God knows every battle, every affliction, every persecution and every hard place I would face in my battle of release, and He was well able to cause me to overcome every one with His wonders! It would not be done by my strength - it would be by His! I was comforted that morning to know that God would be with me just as He was with Moses and that His powerful "wonders" would be manifested on my behalf with each new skirmish! We, like the children of Israel, can be assured that our God has heard our every cry and that He has come down to rescue and deliver us into our divine, covenanted places of destiny that flow with milk and honey!

What difficult battles are you going through in your life today? What has been your "Egypt" experience? Be encouraged that God has an awesome "wonder" planned for your victory and release and, through it all, He will be with you just as He was with Moses!

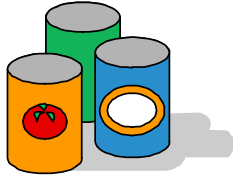
